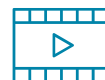
# We helped shape policy across the UK

We gave evidence to a number of select committee inquiries this year – and saw broad take-up of our proposals. We also gave evidence to a number of Welsh Government and National Assembly consultations.

The Business, Innovation and Skills Select Committee’s inquiry into adult literacy and numeracy based many of its recommendations on our own evidence. We advised the committee through oral evidence, as well as hosting a visit to Leicester College and Leicester Prison.

The House of Lords Select Committee inquiry into the UK’s digital competitiveness highlighted our key messages as central findings in its own report: that lifelong learning is essential to digital growth, and ‘digital’ is the third basic skill, alongside English and maths.

We secured wins through our work with government departments. Our advice to BIS on its traineeship programme, to create a more inclusive scheme, was implemented. We welcomed the launch of the first cross-government ‘task and finish group’ on young adult carers – a key recommendation of the National Policy Forum for Young Adult Carers, which we convene.
